

Tuition/Financial Assistance Overview 2012-2013

The 2012-2013 tuition and fee rates have not been finalized by the UA. However, it is safe to assume that they will be higher than the 2011-2012 rates, which are listed below:

Financial Assistance for Math and Science Students only:

- Teach Arizona **math and science** students will receive some tuition assistance from the University of Arizona. Exact assistance amounts cannot be determined at this time since it depends on the number of math/science students we admit to the program. We will give you that information as soon as possible. You must complete a scholarship application by **February 17, 2012** to receive this assistance. Apply **now**; do not wait to see if you have been admitted to Teach Arizona. - Teach Arizona **math** students may be eligible for a Southern Arizona Inducting New Teachers (SAINT) grant that awards \$5000 in tuition assistance to math candidates who participate in Teach Arizona and commit to teach in high-need schools in the Tucson Unified School District for three or more years following graduation. During their first three years of teaching, participants will take part in induction and mentoring programs offered by the Center for Recruitment and Retention of Mathematics Teachers (CRR). Financial Assistance for Social Studies, English and Spanish Students only:

- **College of Education Scholarships:** Teach Arizona social studies, English and Spanish students are eligible to apply for College of Education Scholarships, which are made possible through the generous support of private donors. You must complete a scholarship application by **February 17, 2012** to receive this assistance. To apply please go to: <http://www.coe.arizona.edu/scholarships>. Apply **now**; do not wait to see if you have been admitted to Teach Arizona. If awarded, you will receive half of the scholarship in Summer Session II and the other half in the Fall Session.

Financial Assistance for All Students:

- **TEACH Grants:** Applicants with a minimum cumulative undergraduate GPA of 3.25 may be eligible for a federal TEACH grant of up to \$4,000 per year, with an aggregate limit for graduate students of \$8,000. The money is disbursed after July 1, 2012. Students who accept this grant money agree to teach full-time

for four years in a Title 1 school in a high-need content area upon graduation. Students are given eight years to fulfill this requirement or they must repay the grant with interest. - **FAFSA:** In addition, guaranteed student loans are available to students if they have completed a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).
 - In order to receive aid, **students must fill out both a 2011-2012 and 2012-2013 FAFSA.**
 - **Apply for these immediately.** Come May 2012, students who have not filled out both FAFSAs will not be awarded for summer until at least 3 weeks after the UA has received their FAFSAs.
 - The application is available on-line at <http://fafsa.ed.gov/>. The University of Arizona federal school code is 001083.
 - Unless there are extreme cases of students maxing out the \$138,000 graduate loan limit, Teach Arizona students are eligible for approximately \$11,700 in loans for Summer 2012, if students have not taken out any other loans in the 2011-12 academic year. If they have, they will not be eligible for as much loan. For Fall 2012-Spring 2013, they will be eligible for \$20,500 in loans. If \$20,500 is not enough, students can also take out additional (credit based) Graduate PLUS loans up to their cost of attendance (around \$25,000 total).

- **Non-Resident Waivers:** The College of Education may have a limited number of non-resident tuition waivers available for Teach Arizona students. This waiver allows a non-resident student to pay resident tuition levels. If you are a non-resident and you wish to apply for a waiver if admitted, let us know immediately.
