## Master's students will select one of three areas of specialization

1. Low vision specialization

*Courses* SERP 519c Advanced Low Vision (2 credits) 504-704 Low Vision Assessment and Intervention Internship (SALUS University)

### Internship

Teacher candidates who select the low vision track will complete 100 hours of their internship at the Desert Low Vision Clinic or with the Arizona State Schools for Deaf and Blind (ASDB) low vision program.

### 2. Students with multiple disabilities

*Two courses selected from* SERP 464 Introduction to Autism Spectrum Disorders (3 credits) SERP 518 Augmentative Communication for Learners with Severe and Multiple Disabilities (3) SERP 513 Assessing and Educating Students with Intellectual and Severe Disabilities (3)

*Internship:* Teacher candidates who specialize in multiple disabilities will complete at least five weeks in an education setting that services students with severe and multiple disabilities in Tucson Unified School District, Sunnyside School District, or Arizona Schools for the Deaf and the Blind.

#### 3. Post-secondary transition

Two courses selected from

SERP 568 Transition Methods (3 credits) (University of Arizona)

ESE 504 Methods and Materials in Special Education—Transition to work (Northern Arizona) ESE 509 Foundations of Special Education—Adolescent Transitioning (Northern Arizona)

*Internship:* Teacher candidates who select the transition track will complete 100 hours of their internship at the Southern Arizona Association for the Visually Impaired (SAAVI) "Steppin' Out" program, designed for post-high school graduates to develop their skills in independent living, assistive technology, orientation and mobility, job readiness, and post-secondary education.

## **Teaching certificate requirements**

If you are not certified as a teacher in Arizona, you will be required to:

- Complete a course in Structured English Immersion. If you take LRC 516 at The University of Arizona, this will count as an elective in your Master's program.
- Take an Arizona/U.S. Constitution course within three years of obtaining your initial certificate.
- Take and pass the AEPA Elementary Professional Knowledge exam in Elementary Education (91) and the Special Education Exam in Visually Impaired (32) unless you are earning a Master's degree in Visual Impairment from The University of Arizona.

Upon completion of your program, you will apply for an Institutional Recommendation for a teaching certificate by obtaining an application from the Dean's Office in the College of Education.
