**Internship** (Individually scheduled. Eight credits total, including 1 credit from Fall 2013)

A total of 8 credit hours of internship are required during the program. These must include 350 contact hours with students who have visual impairments. You will enroll in internship hours when there is an arrangement available in your community that meets your schedule needs, at any point after summer of 2014. You should maintain a list of hours and activities completed using the intern contract.

### **Teaching certificate requirements**

If you are not certified as a teacher in Arizona, you will be required to:

- Complete a course in Structured English Immersion. If you take LRC 516 at The University of Arizona, this will count as an elective in your Master's program.
- Take an Arizona/U.S. Constitution course within three years of obtaining your initial certificate.
- Take and pass the AEPA Elementary Professional Knowledge exam in Elementary Education (91) and the Special Education Exam in Visually Impaired (32) unless you are earning a Master's degree in Visual Impairment from The University of Arizona.

Upon completion of your program, you will apply for an Institutional Recommendation for a teaching certificate by obtaining an application from the Dean's Office in the College of Education.
