Show them your HS Plan so that they ‘know that you have goals in life and really want to accomplish them.’ Ask them to copy your HS Plan and to keep it in your student file if possible. Ask: “Am I on track for college and if not, how do I get on track?” – Share: “I want to be a/an _____.” Exception: If you are wanting to get into any class that requires something more of you (i.e. Honors classes, GATE classes, Spanish for native speakers), and you are not registered for it and need to switch it, you need to see your counselor immediately at the beginning of the school year.			2-3 visits this year! Ask: “Am I on track? Am I taking all the right classes for my college plans and future career path?” Ask: about any extracurriculars you should be taking. Ask: about taking the PSATs? Do you need to pay for it? Ask: about mentors or experts to talk to me about your career interests Ask: about summer programs and how you can get into them. Ask: “Can you help me find colleges that specialize in my career options?” Scholarships: Can you help me find specific scholarships now?			3-4 visits this year! SAT & ACT: What is the schedule? What is the cost? How do I prepare for these tests? What is a good score for scholarships? Scholarships: Can you help me find specific scholarships now? Ask: Can you help me fill out financial aid and college application forms? Compile Letters of Recommendation. College Tour trips: how do I sign up? What is the cost? Can it be waived?
